

Ian Bayne

Ian Bayne is a nationally syndicated radio personality and represented voiceover talent.

He launched his political career in 1999 as the founder and chairman of the state GOP chartered *Massachusetts Republican Society PAC*.

As chairman, Bayne grew his PAC to just over 1,000 members, including prominent business leaders and elected representatives.

From 1999 until 2004, Bayne appeared as a commentator on Boston local television and radio, including local Comcast, CBS, NBC, ABC, and Fox affiliates, WGBH Public Television with Margie Reedy, the Hillman Morning Show on 107.3FM, Blute & Moes in the Morning on WRKO AM 680, WBZ Newsradio 1030 AM, as well as the Boston Globe, Boston Herald and many other print dailies and weeklies.

In 2003, Bayne led a public effort to repeal the town of Natick Massachusetts' trash tax.

Also in 2003, Bayne led an effort discrediting US Senator and then-presidential candidate John Kerry for fundraising during memorial services for a local soldier.

Just prior to that event, also in 2003, Bayne joined forces with a local tax advocate group and various radio talk show hosts across Massachusetts to repeal a vote that would put into place mandatory seat belt laws. The vote was overturned in just under a week.

In Spring of 2002, Bayne led the "Draft Romney" effort that led to the overthrow of a liberal GOP governor in favor of then candidate Mitt Romney, paving the way for his nomination and win.

In November 2001, at age 28, Ian was nominated for chairman of the Massachusetts Republican Party. He won around 30% of the vote in a one-on-one race against a later-governor of Massachusetts.

In 2000, Bayne served as communications director for the highly covered and highly controversial Robinson US senate campaign against Senator Kennedy.

Bayne retired from politics in 2004 in order to start a business which thrives today. He had just been named "The Youngest Kingmaker" of GOP politics in MA by The American Spectator Magazine, and given up a radio show "The Ian Bayne Show" on WPEP 1570 AM.

Ian Bayne was born in Evanston, Illinois in 1973. He is a member of the Screen Actor's Guild (SAG) and the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists (AFTRA).
